Thank you for your letter of 24 June 2013, concerning your constituent, [REDACTED], and the outstanding accounts for the above companies.

Firstly, as Coventry City Football Club Limited is in Administration I cannot pursue this company for the outstanding accounts. For further information you will need to contact the Administrators, Paul Appleton and Stephen Katz of David Rubin & Partners LLP. Their address is:

However, my Enforcement team are actively pursuing the overdue accounts of Coventry City Football Club (Holdings) Limited; we have written to the directors warning them they may face criminal proceedings if they are not filed.

Sky Blue Sports & Leisure Limited has also not filed its accounts for 2012, and I had instigated action to remove the company from the register because I had reason to believe the company was defunct: not in business or operating. This was because not only had it failed to file its accounts but because the company and its directors failed to respond to our letters asking for the accounts to be filed. However, this action has now been stopped in light of

your constituent's complaint; my Enforcement team will now co-ordinate further pursuit action on both of these companies with a view to securing the filing of the accounts.

I note your constituent's comments concerning the content of previous years' accounts, and I will treat this as a complaint against the accounts and have them examined by one of our accountants. However, [REDACTED] has not given any detail of why Mr Fisher believes the accounts to be in 'a mess', and if he does has any further information or evidence on this we would appreciate sight of it. It would better enable us to determine whether the company should prepare and provide a revised set of accounts for entry on the public record.
